## Fast medicine – mobile ambulance points for Uzbekistan

To make medical help available to mothers and children even in places where the nearest doctor's practice is more than a day's journey away, was the intent of the Uzbek "Soglom Avlod Utschun" foundation meaning "for the health of the young generation".

15 mobile outpatient stations for pediatric medicine and gynaecology have been equipped with custom-adapted instrumentation and a modern master control station was designed for directing and coordinating their optimal exploitation across the whole of this Asian republic.

A factor of prime importance was the need to come up with apparatus and equipment packages to facilitate a multitude of examinations on a minimum of available floor space. Accordingly, these vehicles were equipped with a colposcope, with ECG and ultra-sonic devices, a treatment stretcher, as well as instruments for visual and audio testing and blood analysis, always with a view to the best possible floor layout and the best possible arrangement of diagnostic and therapeutic work sequences.

Naturally, this required the planning and integration of air conditioners, water supply and power supply facilities.

In addition to equipment, the contract also included training to Uzbek medical care personnel by a doctor and technicians of those companies which were a party to the project: Carl Zeiss, BINZ and Mercedes-Benz.

These mobile ambulance cars have been successfully operating since the autumn of 1995. They make a decisive contribution to improving the level of medical care for mothers and children in the fourteen administration districts of Uzbekistan.

Mrs. Juldascheva, Chairman of the "Soglom Avlod Utschun" foundation put it like this: "This project has enabled us to extend medical care to Uzbek women and children living far away from our cities and even to provide comprehensive assistance to poor families."
